ILLUSTRATED REPORT ON OUR PROJECT IN PORTSMOUTH

26 JUNE UNTIL 16 JULY 2016 (BY MARIE-SOPHIE)

During my free time in Portsmouth I spent a lot of time on going sightseeing and shopping.

1. Spinnaker Tower

We visited the Spinnaker Tower. It is the city's landmark with a height of 170 metres. The tower offers a 360° view of Portsmouth on three different observation platforms. The first platform can be found at 100 meters above sea level and has a glass floor. When we were there, the weather was good and we had a wonderful view of the city. We also walked on the glass floor on the first viewing deck.



2. Isle of Wight

One day we were at the Isle of Wight and went there for a walk. The Isle is the largest and second-most populous island in England. It is located at the south coast of Great Britain. From Portsmouth you can get there by ferry in about 20 to 25 minutes. The beach is beautiful and the landscape is lovely.

3. Gosport

Gosport is a town on a peninsula which you can reach from Portsmouth by ferry. The town is rather small and we saw a few shops and playgrounds. We were there and walked a little and had a picnic on the grass.

4. London

At one of the weekends, we got to the capital of England, London, by train. I had never been to London before. So, I visited the most popular

places: London Eye, Big Ben, Westminster Abbey, Buckingham Palace, Tower Bridge, Tower of London, Hard Rock Café, London Bridge and Piccadilly Circus. The day was stressful but worthwhile. I think that was my favourite activity in England because the city is beautiful and it was very interesting to see some of the places I had heard about before.





5. Brighton

We went to Brighton, which is a coastal city, by train. I think the city is not that spectacular. However, the beach with the pier is wonderful. At the pier there is a big wheel and it looks like a funfair in Germany. In other respects, the city did not offer much more from my point of view.





6. Gunwharf Quays

Gunwharf Quays is an outlet retail destination with 90 outlet stores and 30 restaurants. We went there early in the evenings to go shopping. I bought some presents for my family at home so that they would have something from England.

7. Laser tag

One evening, we played laser tag against a group of young boys. Unfortunately, we lost the game but we had lots of fun. For me it was the first time and I think the game can cause high adrenaline levels.

HOST FAMILY

I lived with a host mother who showed me the English lifestyle and culture. She was a really nice person and I talked to her a lot. She tried to make me feel at home during my time in England.

COLLEGE

The Meridian School is in the Guildhall, which is a multi-use venue in the centre of Portsmouth. It was constructed in 1890.

The language course was about preparing us for our work placements.

We were separated into different groups so that we could meet people from all over the world. In my group I worked together with an Italian, a Brazilian and a Taiwanese. We learned to speak English more confidently. It was easier to use English because somehow we had to communicate with each other.

In my opinion, the language course was good because of the different tasks like job interviews and role plays.

However, I think there was not enough Business English. It was fun and I could speak a lot but I could not improve my Business English for my work placement.

WORK PLACEMENT

I did my work placement at the company "Community Empowerment Limited", which is a charity organisation. The goal of the company is to support young people by teaching English and computer literacy. Moreover, they help people to start their own business and offer marketing and finance classes for them. In addition, if public sector entities have financial problems, the company offers help with advertising efforts.

During my time there, I had different tasks. I did a lot of research using the internal database and the internet. We published results on Facebook, Instagram and similar media. The company wants to keep the people interested and informed. Moreover, I wrote reports on different subjects. For example, I visited a music exhibition in the Guildhall in Portsmouth or I went on a trip around Portsmouth with some Bulgarian students. These reports were published on the internet.

WORK PLACEMENT

My tasks (in short):

- ✓ Typing and setting up documents such as letters and reports
- √ Keeping computer records up to date
- √ Using office equipment
- √ Taking part in a health and safety induction
- ✓ Preparing scripts for students
- ✓ Doing research using the internal database and the internet
- ✓ Publishing a report

It was a pleasure for me because I could work independently and improve my written and spoken English. I like the people there. Since then, I have been staying in contact with one of the employees of Community Empowerment Limited. The company has moved to Southampton and, if I can, I will visit them again.

MY ADVICE

All in all, the trip was a big success and pleasure for me and it was a time of my life I wouldn't have missed for anything.


It helps me with my written and spoken English.

In this way, you gain experience.




My Advice



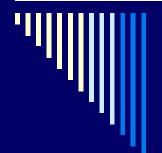



I had a great time during my stay in Portsmouth. Before the arrival, it is important to change your money into pounds. I spent my spare time primarily with the other project participants and with my host sister.

There are a lot of possibilities to spend your free time here. In Portsmouth you can find many places of cultural interest. For example, you can go to the Spinnaker Tower, the Harbour, the D-Day Museum and many other sights.

Moreover, Portsmouth has many places where you can eat well and have a good time. On the weekends, you can visit other cities. The cities of London and Brighton, which you can reach by train in about an hour, are worth seeing. Moreover, you have the chance to use the ferry to go to an island called Isle of Wight.





My host mother was a wonderful hostess and she did everything to make me feel comfortable. She has a fifteen-year-old daughter and we also got along extremely well. I especially liked the fact that we did not exclusively learn Business English at the college. Still, we were prepared very well for taking part in English working life.



My teacher was Agnieszka. She comes from Poland and this was an advantage because she knew exactly which things would be harder or easier for us.

I did my internship at the Lighthouse Charity Shop and had the following duties:

- Serving and advising customers
- Taking payment
- Helping customers to find the goods they want
- Advising on stock amounts
- Giving information on products and services
- Stocking shelves / displaying goods
- Handling complaints and/or passing complaints on

The working atmosphere in the team was really good. On my first day they gave me a very warm welcome and provided me with a lot of valuable tips for everyday life in Portsmouth. The team members always support each other and they offered help when I needed it.

From my training company in Germany I know that your supervisor can sometimes tell you quite directly if he or she is not pleased with something. During our preparations for the trip to Portsmouth, Mr. Frank explained that you can expect people in England to offer criticism in a more indirect way.



My advice to all the other pupils, if they also want to have such a great experience, is the following...

Do not be shy. The people are so nice and friendly. You should just talk to them. Even if you do not speak English perfectly, you should stay calm and just go to the people. They will correct you but that is not meant to be unfriendly. On the contrary, they are trying to help you and they show you how to get it right. You are, after all, there to improve your English.

LUKAS'S REPORT ON HIS STAY IN PORTSMOUTH:

1) PORTSMOUTH – What did you do in Portsmouth during your free time?

LYNN'S ILLUSTRATED REPORT ON OUR PROJECT IN PORTSMOUTH

Our three-week stay in Portsmouth, England, consisted of a one-week language course and a two-week work placement.

I lived with a host family, where we learned about English culture and lifestyle. My host mother was a really nice person and did her best to make sure that we felt at home.

The language course was about preparing us for our work placements. In my opinion, the course helped me to speak English more confidently but there was not enough Business English during the lessons. My host family was very friendly. I brought them a small gift from Germany when I arrived in Portsmouth.


